

San Francisco psychiatrist and Jungian analyst John Beebe, MD, has developed an eight-function / eight archetype model of psychological types. In using this model, the clinical practitioner can see how the inner figures use types of consciousness to structure the process of individuation. In each session, Dr Beebe will use film clips to help us recognize basic archetypes and types; he will also provide vignettes from clinical cases, with group discussion to follow.

Dr Beebe has lectured on analytical psychology in Africa, Asia, Europe, and North and South America. A past president of the C. G. Jung Institute of San Francisco, he is the author of Integrity in Depth, The Presence of the Feminine in Film, and numerous papers and book chapters. This is his first appearance in Hong Kong.

DAY ONE: SESSIONS 1 - 4 The Analysis of Consciousness as a Series of Typical Functions

1. Dr Beebe will describe the differentiation of the superior function from all the other functions so as to become the centerpiece of a strong ego and the Hero/Heroine of the person's individuation process. The role of the therapist in facilitating or inhibiting this process of finding a person's top strength will be discussed.
2. We will explore figures of the opposite gender that oppose and compensate the superior function Hero. These are the opposing personality and the anima/animus.
3. The role of the auxiliary function as a caretaker (Mother/Father) will be discussed. The role of a therapist is helping the patient learn to use the auxiliary function in a caretaking way will be defined. The danger of others taking the auxiliary function for granted will be explored.
4. The inferior and tertiary function will be the focus. The association of the archetype of the Anima and Animus with the inferior

function and the Puer Aeternus and Puella Aeterna will be explored. The difference between the "inferiority" of the inferior function and the "weakness" of the tertiary function will be explained.

DAY TWO: SESSIONS 5-8 The Analysis of the Shadow Using Typology

5. The Demonic Personality (eighth function) will be introduced as something that undermines the Hero (superior function). The typological differences between Hero and Demonic Personality will be explored. The Demonic Personality will be discussed as the darkest archetype of the shadow.
6. We will explore life situations in which the Demonic Personality is redeemed to become an inner Daimon, a helpful figure, will be explored.
7. The shadow sides of the good parent, the Witch and Senex, will be exposed. Their role as archetypal "defenses of the self" will be explained.
8. The integration of the Trickster by the Anima will be explored as a critically important psychological process that enables the Anima to become strong enough to stand up to the Demonic.

DAY THREE: SESSIONS 9 - 12 The Path of Individuation from a Typological Perspective

9. The process by which the Demonic function is turned Daimonic as a consequence of the integrity of the Anima or Animus is illustrated.

10. A new archetype, the Opposing Personality (the archetype associated with the shadow of the Heroic superior function), will be presented as a seduction that can challenge and disrupt individuation by tempting the Superior Function to move away from the spine of its integrity. Dr Beebe will explain how the Opposing Personality can be both the start and the finish of many individuation journeys.

11. The Opposing Personality will be analyzed as a defense of the self against vulnerability, with implications for the understanding of the psyche's handling of trauma through this part of our typology. The underlying vulnerability of the Opposing Personality itself will be explored, including its role in protecting unhealed wounds in the infantile psyche.
12. We return to a common problem in type development, which Dr Beebe has named "the Third Function Crisis." This is experienced most often by people in middle life who cannot get out of the cycles of inflation and deflation associated with the archetypes of the Puer Aeternus and Puella Aeterna. Their unconscious need is to integrate the Trickster to stabilize the third function's association with these archetypes. When the Trickster shadow has been accepted and integrated, however, individuation can proceed along the lines Jung and von Franz describe: the inferior function can be approached, and the personality can be integrated by the anima or animus, at which point typology becomes wholeness.
